

Our Beliefs

Jesus Christ

Jesus Christ is the Word that became flesh and dwelt among us, equal with the Father. He is God's Son, born of a virgin, who lived a sinless life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sin of the world through His death on the cross. He arose from the dead demonstrating His victory over sin and death, giving Him preeminence in everything. He ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of God, and intercedes for His church. He will return in power and glory, receive His church unto Himself, and establish His kingdom forever.

The Trinity

There is only one true and living God. He is all present, all powerful, and all knowing. He is perfect in all His attributes. God is holy, just, loving, and merciful. He is creator and sustainer of the universe and has revealed Himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Bible

The Bible is God's Word to us revealing Himself, His purposes, and His plans. It is God breathed and was written by men under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is truth without any mixture of error and is the supreme standard by which all beliefs, conduct, and opinions should be tried.

The Separation

By choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. As a result, we are separated from the life and fellowship of God. The Reconciliation

We cannot earn or maintain it by our own works or goodness. Salvation begins with the new birth, continues throughout our life of discipleship, and culminates in our being with Him in His eternal kingdom. Discipleship

Discipleship is the process of growing in grace and being conformed to the image of Christ. It is initiated by the Holy Spirit through His convicting of sin, revealing the truth, and exalting Christ. It becomes reality in our experience through faith and obedience. Discipleship involves forsaking all, self-denial, personal sacrifice, renewing of the mind, and perseverance. All true believers are Disciples of Christ.

Our Beliefs (Cont.)

Mankind:

Man is created in the image of God and as the supreme objects of His creation. God wonderfully and immutably made each person as male or female, and two distinct, complementary genders together reflect that therefore, rejection of one's biological gender rejection of the image of God within that person. End Times:

God, His own time and way, will bring the world to its appropriate end. According to His promise, Jesus Christ will return personally and visibly in glory to earth; the dead will be raised and Christ will judge all men according to righteousness. The unrighteous will be confined to everlasting punishment. The righteous, in their glorified bodies, will receive their reward and will dwell forever in His presence. Marriage:

God created marriage to be the uniting of one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union. God intends that intimate sexual activity is to occur exclusively within that union of one man and one woman. Marriage uniquely reflects Christ's relationship with His Church. Gen 1:18-25; 1Cor 7:1-2; Eph 5:31-32; 1Thes 4:3

Human Life:

All human life is sacred and created by God in His Human life is of inestimable worth in all its dimensions, stages, or conditions from conception through natural death. As believers, we are called to value all human life. Gen 1:26-27; Ps 139

Final Authority for Matters of Belief and Conduct:

This statement of faith does not exhaust the extent of our beliefs. The Bible, itself, the and infallible Word of God that speaks with final authority concerning truth, morality, and the proper conduct of mankind, is the sole and final source of all that we believe. For purposes of The Open Door's faith, doctrine (beliefs), practice, policy, and discipline, our elder board is the final interpretive authority on the Bible's meaning and application. Expectations of Leaders and Volunteers

"And the things that thou has heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also." 2 Timothy 2:2

Personal Expectations:

- A saved, baptized, growing member who participates in the ministry of the church.
- Faithful in weekly church attendance & regular devotions.
- Views the Bible as God's instructions for faith and daily living
- A regular financial giver to the ministries of the church.
- Exemplary in dress, presenting God's temple nicely at all times.
- Demonstrates Christ's attitude in speech; encourages others and refrains from gossip.
- Committed to conducting yourself in a manner worthy of respect in the family, community and workplace.
- Has the desire and ability to allocate time for others.
- Dependable and committed to timely completion of ministry task, attendance and goal
- Committed to participate and lead in Ministry Training and Development.
- Committed to the overall ministry of the church, while overseeing particular area.

Terms of Service:

- Ministry leaders commit to serving for two years.
- Members of the volunteer team for each ministry commit to serving for one year.
- Ideally serve in a specific ministry no more than twice a month.
- If serving in any ministry that ministers to minors be child safety trained and have a current background check.
- If new to The Open Door, must have been united with us for a minimum of 3 months, and completed or scheduled for membership (with Pastor's consent).

Evangelism

The Open Door ministry endeavors to evangelize the lost. God has given clear directives to His followers to "make disciples" (Matt 28:18- - 20) and to "train up others" (2 Tim 2:2) so that the gospel is furthered. One of the ingredients to a healthy ministry is that the unconverted are evangelized. This can take place through a myriad of ways—door to door evangelism, street preaching, street witnessing, personal evangelism with friends, family members, coworkers, neighbors, etc., evangelistic meetings/services, outreach events, concerts, and a host of other ways. One of the goals of ministry is to proclaim Christ and Him crucified at all times not only to edify believers but to evangelize the lost.



The Open Door - Missions Ministry

The Open Door gives 20% of offerings received to ministries whose purpose is not Open Door growth related and instead is focused on the mission of furthering the gospel to the whole world.

- Hope In Christ Ministries, Inc: Provides ministry of encouragement to men and women, individual teaching and discipleship, as well as transformative prayer ministry offered to individuals by appointment, church-wide Seminars and bible study. The Hope In Christ office is within The Open Door and led by Jo Ann Buckley, a member of The Open Door.
- Living Springs Faith Ministries: Living Springs Faith Ministries promotes holistic township transformation through missional church planting, grassroots community empowerment projects, and local leadership development in South Africa and Zambia. The origin of Living Spring Faith Ministries began in South Africa in 2002 and is led by Gabriel Fabule.
- Alaska Missions and Retreats: Alaska Missions serves the local Alaskan Natives through building relationships and meeting physical and spiritual needs. Alaska Missions was founded by Brenda Crim in 2005 and has been supported by The Open Door from the beginning.
- Ranchos Los Amigos: Ranchos Los Amigos is a division of Youth With A Mission. YWAM is an international movement of Christians from many denominations dedicated to serving Jesus throughout the world. In 1983 *Rancho Los Amigos* came under the YWAM leadership. Rancho Los Amigos is a children's home situated on 12 acres that provided a haven to abandoned, neglected, and abused children from various parts of Mexico.
- Evangeline Baptists Association and Louisiana Baptists Association: These two associations assist the cooperating churches in their tasks of fulfilling Christ's Great Commission to build the Kingdom of God. Evangeline Baptist Association ministers in a geographical setting, providing churches in that area to do a greater work together in their community. Louisiana Baptists Association is a statewide association of over 1,600 Baptist churches connected through a common mission. Louisiana Baptists churches are connected with more than 40,000 other Southern Baptist Churches throughout the United States.
- Gaudet Family: The Open Door supports the Gaudet family, former active members of The Open Door with their missionary work in Thailand. The Gaudets have partnered with local Thai missionaries and pastors as well as The Free Burma Rangers, and are using their blessings and resources to enable and equip local Thai Christians to live out the Great Commission and win souls for the kingdom. The Gaudets have received support since August 2018.



Education

The Open Door ministry endeavors to educate God's children (the saint). Paul charges young Timothy to have one major preoccupation in the local Church, namely, to "preach the Word" (2 Tim 4:2). This must drive his ministry and be the defining point of who he is and what he does in the church. This command is so solemn that Paul charges Timothy "in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus who is to judge the living and the dead" (2 Tim 4:1). There is no more weighty reason to preach the word than this. To preach and teach expositionally means to make clear what God's Word says and to apply that authorial meaning to the hearts and lives of the hearers. The elders in the early church gave themselves to prayer and to the ministry of the Word (Acts 6:4). Paul is to not neglect the teaching of the Word (1 Tim 4:13). Every biblical ministry must have the reading, preaching, and teaching of God's Word as its primary form of worship. The preaching (& teaching) of God's Word is, in Luther's words, "the highest form of worship."



Royal Ambassadors & Girls in Action

Purpose:

To instill God's plan of salvation through Jesus Christ in the hearts and minds of children from 1st grade to 5th grade and disciple them in living outrageously for Jesus.

Goals:
